


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What is Lean?

- Term used to describe what was observed at Toyota and other Japanese companies,
 also called Toyota Production System (TPS)
- U.S. studied TPS to understand automaker growth in quality and sales
- Key focus is to engage employees in solving problems and becoming flexible, not just more productive
- Work smarter to grow organization, NOT harder with fewer people
- The ultimate goal is to maximize customer value by minimizing waste, free up resources to add more value



The Toyota Production System

Continuous improvement

- Systems force problems to the surface, problems are good
- Never ending quest for perfection


Respect for Humanity

- Workers are the experts and should help make improvements
- Improvements are made through experiments and observations at the work area (gemba)


